Statement on lithium batteries

Royal Mail published updated guidance in July 2013 on '*prohibitions and restrictions in UK and international mail*' for dangerous goods including lithium batteries.

The guidance states that lithium batteries are:

- Prohibited when sent on their own in both domestic and international post
- Allowed in UK and international post when contained in a device¹ but are prohibited in Business Response, FreepostTM, PacketpostTM and PacketsortTM.
- Allowed in UK post when sent with a device but are prohibited in Royal Mail Tracked Returns,[®] Business Response, FreepostTM, and all variants of PacketpostTM and Packetsort.TM

BBMA members work to ensure compliance with the existing regulations² and support these guidelines in full.
